

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) believes a diverse scientific work force is critical to achieving our mission of curing all blood cancers. Our **Underrepresented Minority Medical Student Research Program** provides minority medical students opportunities to experience cutting-edge research alongside experienced blood cancer scientists.

Students will perform laboratory research for one year and will be provided with \$75,000 for living expenses and up to \$5,000 for relocation costs.

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Must be a 2nd-4th year medical student at an LCME-accredited medical school in good standing by the application due date
- Must be Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino(a), American Indian/Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander
- Must be a United States citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. or a U.S. territory
- Applicants must submit:
  - A personal statement detailing their interest in blood cancer research
  - Most recent transcript
  - A letter of support from a dean of the student's medical school
  - A second supporting letter from a professor or other doctoral-level administrator
